

Our Journey Begins ...

- In 2016, Dr. Dana Suskind visits Pensacola to share her vision and support of Pensacola as an Early Learning City.
- From 2017-2019, Studer Community Institute partners with the University of Chicago to examine the effectiveness of using a video about early brain development with new mothers in a hospital setting.
- Over 1,000 Pensacola moms participated in the study.

Findings:


- Moms from <u>both low- and high-socioeconomic</u> status groups increased their knowledge about brain and language development.
- The study supported that such an intervention can be made part of routine postpartum care by healthcare professionals **and it will be successful**.
- The study showed that the video lesson can work.



Research from Hart and Risely (1995) suggests that by age three, children from a lower socioeconomic status heard **30 million words fewer** than children from a higher socioeconomic status.







Critical periods of time - windows of opportunity





"The **highest rate of return** in early childhood development comes from **investing as early as possible**, from birth through age five, in disadvantaged families. Starting at age three or four is too little too late, as it fails to recognize that skills beget skills in a complementary and dynamic way. Efforts should focus on the first years for the greatest efficiency and effectiveness."






1. Congratulations and Well Wishes to Baby Card
